## **CHECK-IN**

Check-in time is after 3 p.m. Eastern time. Please remember your door access code as it will be used during your entire stay. The code is changed after each guest's visit.

## **UPON ARRIVAL:**

- Once you enter the cabin for the first time, please proceed to the alarm control panel located on the wall near the top of the steps. If it is beeping, enter the code provided in the check-in email you received. Failure to do so could cause the alarm system to activate.
- Report any damages or malfunctioning appliances to us immediately by calling 615-308-5236.
- Feel free to set the thermostats at a comfortable temperature for you, but please do not set it below 70 degrees. Remember to set it back to the temperature listed below upon your departure.
- Failure to do so could result in extra charges to you.

## **CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES**

Check out time is on or before 10 a.m. When you check out, please:

1. Bag all trash and place it in the outside containers. Do not leave trash on or beside the containers or on the porch as it will attract all kinds of critters, including bears.
2. Place all dirty towels and wash cloths in the bath tub for their bathroom.
3. Leave bed linens on their beds.
4. Wash all dirty dishes and return them to their proper storage place.
5. Turn off all interior and exterior lights.

6. Set both thermostats as appropriate: heat to 60 degrees in winter or air conditioning to 80 degrees in summer.
7. Place the ice maker sensor arm in OFF position (up) and empty the ice bin.
8. Close all blinds on all windows and lock all exterior doors.

#### NO SMOKING

Our cabin is a Non-Smoking cabin. This includes the balconies. Evidence of smoking inside or outside the property will result in immediate eviction and forfeiture of all amounts paid, including the refundable damage deposit.

#### NO PETS

No pets are allowed in the cabin. If any evidence of pet habitation is discovered, this constitutes grounds for immediate eviction and forfeiture of all amounts paid, including the refundable damage deposit. Excess Damage Cost and Cleaning will also be charged to the GUEST.

#### NO HOUSE PARTIES

This is a family vacation cabin; under NO CIRCUMSTANCES will there be House Parties for large groups. Occupancy exceeding 10 people without prior approval will result in immediate eviction and forfeiture of all amounts paid, including the refundable damage deposit.

#### FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

There are two fire extinguishers in the cabin – one on each floor. The upstairs extinguisher is located in the cabinet under the kitchen sink. The downstairs extinguisher is located in the maintenance closet in the game room.

#### EMERGENCY ESCAPE LADDER

Should an emergency situation arise that requires guests to escape the cabin from the lower level, there is an emergency escape ladder located in the closet in the game room where the fire extinguisher is located. This ladder can be attached to the deck railing or to the window seals in one of the bedrooms. The box should be opened and the ladder deployed **ONLY** in an actual emergency situation. Opening the box and/or deploying the ladder in a non-emergency situation will result in loss of all of the refundable damage deposit.

#### FREE WI FI

Our cabin has free secured wifi available. The access code is **ggetaway1536**.

#### BED LINENS

One set of bed linens is provided for each bed. Linens for the pull-out bed in the downstairs media room are in a packet on the sofa. Extra pillows are located in closets and/or chests throughout the cabin.

#### TOWELS & WASH CLOTHS

Each full bath is supplied with 4 bath towels, 4 wash cloths and 2 hand towels. If you desire, you may wash towels and wash cloths during your stay.

#### KEY TO TRASH BINS

The key to the trash bins is located on a hook to the right of the entrance door.

#### TRASH BAGS

Each trash can is supplied with a starter supply of liners – the liner on the can and 1 in the bottom of the can. During your stay, you may need to purchase additional liners at a retail store. All trash MUST be bagged. Failure to bag all trash may result in loss of some or all of the damage deposit.

#### TRASH PICK-UP

Make sure all trash is placed in the containers outside in the secured containers. Bears and other critters will rummage through it if you don't. This could result in an additional clean-up charge to you. If, during your stay, the outside containers become full, please call 615-308-5236 so we can arrange a trash pickup.

#### KITCHEN SUPPLIES

The kitchen is supplied with 1 dish towel and 1 dish cloth, as well as 2 pods for the dish washer and 1 bottle of liquid dish detergent. During your stay, you may have to purchase additional dish washer detergent and other supplies.

#### TV/INTERNET/MEDIA/ELECTRONIS

Each TV must be set to channel 3. Use the TV remote to make sure the correct "source or input" is selected for your viewing choice; i.e., to view TV select "Satellite."

As in any home, appliances and electronic equipment may malfunction on occasion. We will make every effort to correct or repair items during regular business hours as soon as possible. No refunds will be given for malfunction of any equipment. If you do attempt to change the settings or cables to the equipment, we will need to send a TV technician to the cabin to reconnect anything necessary to restore proper working order and Guest will be charged for the service call.

Further, Grand Getaway is equipped with state of the art televisions and home theater equipment, and we strive to maintain this equipment and provide a significant amount of choices from the satellite provider. We do, however, have restrictions in place to block access to channels that require additional payment. Also, the home theater in the family room is set up with a universal remote that has been specifically programmed to allow the easiest possible accessibility for our guests. In the event that a guest tampers with the equipment in order to gain viewing of blocked channels or equipment is unhooked or altered for game hookups and is not returned to original status and we have to call the satellite provider for a service call, some or all of the damage deposit may be forfeited. Also, if a guest breaks or damages the universal remote, the Guest will be charged for the replacement of the remote. This remote is not a toy, and children should never be allowed to use it or play with it. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

A listing of the available television channels is at the back of this booklet.

See the information sheet at the back of this booklet for instructions on using the remotes to view TVs and DVDs.

## TELEPHONE

There are no charges for local calls, just pick up the receiver and dial as usual. We also have free domestic long distance. Should you desire to make an overseas long distance call, you will need to use a credit card. The area code for Sevier County is 865. Remember to make local calls you will not need to use the area code.

## GAS GRILL

The grill is fueled by propane. To turn on the gas to the grill, simply turn the timer located on the floor to the lower left of the grill in a clockwise direction. **IF YOU SMELL GAS, DO NOT HAVE ANY OPEN FLAMES NEARBY AND CALL THE EMERGENCY NUMBERS IMMEDIATELY.**

## WATER AND SEPTIC SYSTEMS

This cabin uses water from Hidden Springs Utilities and a septic system operated by Tennessee Waste Water. The septic system is very effective. However, it WILL clog if improper material is flushed. DO NOT FLUSH anything other than toilet paper. No feminine products, diapers or other articles that might clog the system should be flushed at anytime. If it is found that such items have been flushed and clog the septic system, the GUEST will be charged for any and all damages. A plunger is located in the closet in the game room.

## STORM POLICY/ROAD CONDITIONS

No refunds will be given for storms, any adverse road conditions or power outages. Mountain roads can be curvy and steep. Please drive with caution.

## MAINTENANCE

Please report all maintenance issues immediately. As in any home, occasionally HVAC, plumbing, electrical, fireplaces, electronics, hot tubs, appliances, etc. may suddenly not function properly. We make every reasonable effort to perform regular scheduled maintenance as this cabin is our second home and we stay here frequently. Please report ALL maintenance issues immediately. We will certainly try to correct any deficiency as soon as possible. We cannot offer refunds or discounts based on malfunctions.

## IRON & IRONING BOARD

An iron and ironing board are provided for guest use. The iron is in the cabinet under the sink in the half bath. The ironing board is hanging behind the door of the half bath. Please return them to their storage place after use.

## BREAKER BOX

Should there be a need, the breaker box for the cabin is located outside on the front of the cabin near the trash cans.

## FIREPLACE

The fireplace is equipped with gas logs. They are operational during the months of October through March dependent upon the anticipated outdoor temperatures. To turn the logs on, simply turn the timer located on the lower right side of the fire box.

## THERMOSTATS

There are 2 thermostats in the cabin. The one upstairs controls the HVAC unit for upstairs, and the one downstairs controls the downstairs HVAC unit. You may set the thermostats to a setting that is comfortable for you. Please make sure both thermostats are reset as described in the Check-Out Procedures above.

## SWIMMING POOL

The swimming pool here at Hidden Springs Resort is available for your use. It is a year-round, heated and enclosed pool. If you do take towels from our cabin with you to the pool, please make sure they are returned. You will be charged for any missing towels when you check out.

## JACUZZI TUB

Before using the Jacuzzi tub in the master suite, make sure the water level is above all of the jets. Please follow the instructions posted on the wall near the tub.

## HOT TUB

Our hot tub is drained, cleaned, refilled and fresh chemicals are added after each guest checks out. Depending on the time the hot tub is filled, it may take a few hours to reach a warm setting (usually 100°F).

Please DO NOT put anything in the hot tub, such as: bath oils, bubbles, food coloring, whipped cream, hot fudge, etc.

For your safety, health warnings are posted on the wall by the hot tub as well as on this page.

### **Caution**

For your safety:

- PREGNANT WOMAN, BABIES, AND PERSONS SUFFERING FROM HEART DISEASE, DIABETES, HIGH OR LOW BLOOD PRESSURE SHOULD NOT ENTER THE HOT TUB WITHOUT PRIOR MEDICAL CONSULTATION AND PERMISSION FROM THEIR DOCTOR.
- DO NOT USE THE HOT TUB WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL; NARCOTICS OR OTHER DRUGS THAT CAUSE SLEEPINESS; DROWSINESS OR RAISE OR LOWER BLOOD PRESSURE.
- THE HOT TUB COVER MUST BE COMPLETELY REMOVED BEFORE ENTERING THE HOT TUB. TO MINIMIZE THE POTENTIAL FOR DAMAGE TO THE COVER, CAREFULLY REMOVE THE COVER USING THE HOT TUB BUTLER ATTACHED TO THE HOT TUB.
- DO NOT SIT, STAND, OR JUMP ON THE HOT TUB COVER.

PLEASE OBSERVE THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AS YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY NEGLIGENCE.

DO NOT USE ALONE. UNSUPERVISED USE BY CHILDREN IS PROHIBITED.

Be cautious of the intake valve by the filter as it has dangerous suction. Do not sit on or near it. Keep children away!

- ENTER AND EXIT SLOWLY

- OBSERVE REASONABLE TIME LIMITS TO AVOID NAUSEA, DIZZINESS AND FAINTING.
- KEEP ALL BREAKABLE OBJECTS OUT OF THE AREA

**Warning:**

DO NOT PUT ANY SOAP, BATH OIL, ETC. IN THE HOT TUB. THIS WILL CAUSE THE TUB TO MALFUNCTION AND WILL PLACE IT OUT OF ORDER FOR AT LEAST A DAY. YOU WILL BE CHARGED FOR REPAIRING ANY DAMAGE CAUSED OR EXTRA CLEANING BY PUTTING MATERIALS INTO HOT TUB.

Please make sure the cover stays on the hot tub when not in use to conserve the heat.

**SAUNA SAFETY GUIDELINES**

It is important to follow certain sauna safety guidelines each and every time you use a sauna—

1. Never wear any jewelry in a sauna. The metal may heat up and possibly burn skin.
2. Drink plenty of cool water—between 2 to 4 glasses—after leaving the sauna. It is easy to become dehydrated due to high temperatures and humidity.
3. After leaving the sauna, step into cooler air, a swimming pool or a cold shower to cool down. Alternate between the hot and cold to get the most out of a sauna experience.
4. Protect hair with a towel or turban, regardless of its length. The intense heat can dry out the hair shafts, causing hair to be brittle and possibly break off.
5. Moisturize your skin after you use the sauna. Your skin can quickly become dry when it hits the air again.
6. Never eat in the sauna or drink alcoholic beverages. Drinking alcohol can possibly lower blood pressure and cause dizziness.
7. Avoid the sauna if you have high blood pressure or heart illness. Always check with your doctor first.
8. Do not eat before you take a sauna as you could become nauseated.
9. Do not stay in a sauna longer than 15 to 20 minutes.

**BEARS**

If you see a bear in the area of our cabin or rummaging through the garbage cans in the area, it is best to stay away. Our cabin has a bear proof garbage can outside to help prevent bears from coming around you. Feeding the bears in the park or surrounding areas is not in your best interest because bears are dangerous and feeding them or purposely leaving trash out for them is illegal. Remember that all bears are dangerous. For your's and everyone else's safety, please do not approach, taunt, or feed the bears.



**INSECTS AND LADY BUGS**

Grand Getaway is sprayed regularly by a professional pest control company. Ladybugs, wasps and other insects sometimes affect rental units. If the bugs or insects are a major problem please call us so we can get the problem taken care of.

A few years ago the National Park Service released millions of ladybugs into the park to fight a tree-killing insect that destroys the park's trees. The ladybug will eat the food source of the bug that is destroying the trees. A large population of these ladybugs is located in the Gatlinburg area. Occasionally, these ladybugs may visit cabins. Once they get inside the cabins they cannot locate an exit. Sadly, the only way of getting rid of them is by vacuuming them up. The park service will not allow you to spray for ladybugs since they were introduced to fight a problem. Ladybugs like warm sunny places such as windows. Even if you remove the ladybugs they will be back again in hours. A ladybug is a small, harmless, reddish/yellowish, bug with small black spots. Some people believe they are good luck bugs. They do not pose a health threat or cause any harm to humans. We will continue to remove these critters upon checkout, but if they appear during your stay please be patient with them.

#### LOST ITEMS

We are not responsible for personal property left behind, stolen or damaged during your stay. If you find you have left something behind, call us at 615-308-5236 and we will try to locate the missing items. If the items are located we will get them back to you as soon as possible.

## Pigeon Forge



Pigeon Forge is located within a day's drive of two-thirds of the U.S. population (70 million people). As one of the major gateways to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, many of the Park's 10 million plus yearly visitors pass through Pigeon Forge. Originally, Pigeon Forge was named for the passenger pigeons that frequented the area when it was settled in the late 1790s and early 1800s. Pioneer Isaac Love established an iron forge along the banks of The Little Pigeon River in 1820 contributing the "forge" to the city's name.

In 1830, Isaac's son William dammed up the Little Pigeon and began construction of the first building of the Old Mill. Almost a 180 years old now, this authentic working mill is listed on the National Register of Historical Places. The Old Mill is one of the most photographed locations of the area. Stop by for a tour, and enjoy a great meal, with fresh products made daily from grains milled on the premises. Pigeon Forge was a sleepy mountain town until the Great Smoky National Park opened in 1934 and changed it into a tourist town. In 1986, Dollywood Theme Park added a new attraction and now hosts millions of tourists yearly.

Pigeon Forge is host to many festivals all year round. From fireworks on the Fourth of July to the magic of Winterfest, there's never a dull moment in Pigeon Forge. Check the Calendar and be sure to make your reservations well in advance! The Grand Rod Run and Shades of the Past are two of the showcase car events held in Pigeon Forge each year, drawing thousands of visitors to each event. Fall Foliage season finds the whole area decorated in the splendor of fall in the Smoky Mountains, with bright colored flowers, cornstalks, scarecrows, pumpkins and bales of hay filling the landscape. The mountains come alive with blazing red, orange and yellow leaves, blending in amongst the evergreens. It provides one of the most incredible feasts for the eyes imagineable Winterfest in Pigeon Forge was chosen winner of the 1998 Shining Example Award for "Festival of the Year" with attendance over 100,000 by the Southeast Tourist Society. The Winterfest Trolley Tour of Lights offers visitors a unique opportunity to see millions of lights and displays, illuminating the whole area from November through February.

Sevier County features numerous music, variety and comedy theaters, as well as exciting dinner theaters. Pigeon Forge is currently the hub of the area's theater activity, including Miracle Theater, Country Tonite, Black Bear Jamboree, Blackwood's Breakfast Variety Show, Dixie Stampede, Great Smoky Mountain Murder Mystery, Magic Beyond Belief, Memories Theater, Patsy Waszak Show, Smith Family Dinner Theater, Smoky Mountain Theater - Temptations Review, Tennessee Shindig and Comedy Barn.

With over 200 factory outlets, Pigeon Forge is an outlet wonderland. It was voted "#1 City for Outlet Shopping" by Outlet Bound magazine and "Favorite Shopping Spot in the South" by Southern Living. It's not surprising that shoppers come by the busloads to take advantage of the discount specials.

Sevier County is a dry county, with the exception of the city of Gatlinburg, which was grand-fathered in many years ago. Within the city limits of Pigeon Forge, beer is available in grocery and convenience stores, and wine can be purchased only at the Smoky Mountain Winery, located on the Parkway and the Hillside Winery located in Governor's Crossing area.

## Gatlinburg



Gatlinburg is a popular mountain resort nestled next to the entrance of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. As the gateway to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Gatlinburg provides the majority of lodging, food and additional recreation for over 10 million visitors each year, making it the most visited National Park in the US. Gatlinburg's popularity is also due to the fact that more than 70 million people live within 400 miles of the city, and its popularity carries over to people of all ages.

Gatlinburg has become an important handicraft center for the Southern US. In the over 400 gift and specialty shops, you will find hand-crafted leather

goods, wood carvings, baskets, quilts, jams and jellies, homemade fudge and candies, jewelry, custom glassware and furniture, antiques, pottery, and other local crafts. The Great Smoky Mountain Arts and Crafts Community, 3 miles east of downtown, (U.S. 321-N), began as a craft show in 1937 and now includes more than 80 craft shops. At a number of shops, visitors can watch as craftsmen display outstanding skills in weaving, pottery, broom-making, woodworking and furniture-making.

You'll find plenty to do in Gatlinburg! The world's largest aerial passenger tramway traverses the mountainside from downtown up to Ober Gatlinburg Ski Resort and Recreation Park. Play miniature golf at Old Gatlinburg Golf & Games, the most unusual course in the area. Set amid trees and flowers, each hole tells a story of the history of this area.

Ride the glass-enclosed elevator 342 feet above Gatlinburg at the Space Needle and Arcade, or explore the Gatlinburg Mysterious Mansion, which is filled with false panels, rotating walls, and sinking floors. You can enjoy a musical comedy at Sweet Fanny Adams Theater and Music Hall, or explore Ripley's Believe It or Not and Guinness World Record museums.

Visitors can also enjoy music festivals, numerous art galleries, and a variety of recreational activities, including fishing, golf, horseback riding, miniature golf, and white-water rafting. Ober Gatlinburg features year-round activities, including an alpine slide, an ice-skating arena, and downhill skiing.

From mid-November through February, the town becomes a winter wonderland when chandeliers of more than two million lights drape across the parkway on the main street and a 28-foot bell tower is set in the center of town. The mountain heritage of Gatlinburg is celebrated with displayed log cabins and automated bears that wave to visitors as they enter town. The event has been named the number-one festival in the South and a Top 100 event in North America by the American Bus Association.

Gatlinburg celebrates love in February with Smoky Mountain Romance. Each year, more than 20,000 couples get married in Gatlinburg, the "Honeymoon Capital of the South". Gatlinburg, and the surrounding area, makes a perfect location for your special day. Your fairy-tale wedding and honeymoon, can become a reality in the Smokies.

The annual Mountains of Chocolate festival is a chocolate lover's dream come true and the proceeds benefit Friends of the Smokies. The Friends have helped preserve our most precious resource, and the native forests, wildlife and flowers and fauna. Learn how to become a member or a volunteer!

Incorporated in 1945, today Gatlinburg boasts a population of approximately 3,500 year round residents. According to the department of tourism, Gatlinburg covers a 10.35 mile radius (6,623 acres). Directions are given according to the ten red lights in the downtown area, which runs almost 3 miles in length.

Sevier County is a dry county, with the exception of the city of Gatlinburg, which was grand-fathered in long ago. Within the city limits of Gatlinburg, you will find award-winning wines at the Smoky Mountain Winery. Alcoholic drinks are available at most restaurants and the local grocery stores and convenience stores carry beer. Package stores are allowed to operate within the city limits.

# Great Smoky Mountain National Park

## Highlights of the National Park



**Established:** The Great Smoky Mountains National Park was created in 1934 to protect the last remnant of the southern Appalachian forest which was being exterminated by extensive logging.



**Area:** The park encompasses 520,976 acres of land.



**Elevations:** The highest elevation is the summit of Clingman's Dome at 6,643 feet above sea level. The lowest point is the mouth of Abrams Creek at 840 feet above sea level.



**Plant Species:** There are over 1,600 species of flowering plants in the park. This includes 125 species of native trees.



**Animal Species:** There are 200 species of birds, 50 species of fish, and 60 species of mammals. The park is America's salamander capital with 30 species of these creatures.



**Number of Visitors:** The park receives almost 10 million visitors each year. It is the most visited national park in our country.



**Park Activities:** The park has an abundance of activities throughout the year including: hiking, bicycling, fishing, picnicking, campfire programs, horseback riding, cross-country skiing, ranger talks and walks, pioneer life exhibits and annual festivals. There is something for all interests and age groups.



**Hiking:** There are over 800 miles of trails to hike. Also, the Appalachian Trail cuts through the Great Smoky Mountains National Park on its way to its southern terminus in Georgia. There is approximately 70 miles of the AT through the park.



**Camping:** The park has 1,008 developed campsites and 100 primitive camp sites.



**Horseback Riding:** The park has an extensive system of trails for horses and is considered the best riding area in the eastern part of the United States.

## Things to do in the National Park

**Auto Touring** - An auto tour of the park offers a chance to see panoramic vistas, rushing mountain streams, weathered historic buildings, and majestic forests stretching to the horizon. Inexpensive booklets are available to serve as your personal tour guides along many park roads.

**Bicycling** - Ride through Cades Cove on a misty summer morning for a truly memorable way to experience the park.

**Camping** - Escape into the Smokies wilderness for a backpacking adventure or opt for a tamer excursion in one of the park's developed campgrounds.

**Fishing** - Anglers can match their skills against wily brook, brown, and rainbow trout on over 700 miles of fishable streams in the park.

**Hiking** - Choose from over 800 miles of trails ranging from quiet walkways to multi-day backpacking treks through the backcountry. Permits are needed for overnight backpacking hikes.

**Horseback Riding** - The park has hundreds of miles of horse trails and five drive-in horse camps. If you don't own a horse, four rental stables provide mounts and guides.

**Pets** - Leashed pets are allowed in developed areas and along roads, but are not allowed on park trails.

**Waterfalls** - Information about the beautiful waterfalls in the park and their trails.

**One Perfect Day** - If you only have one day to visit the Great Smoky Mountains National Park .....

If you only have one day to visit the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, the following itinerary will give you an excellent overview of the park and all its wonders.

Begin at the Sugarlands Visitor's Center, two miles south of Gatlinburg. There you can enjoy an interesting park film, visit the excellent natural history exhibit and participate in short ranger talks and slide shows.

From Sugarlands, proceed to Cades Cove and enjoy the 11 mile Cades Cove Loop Road where the National Park Service maintains historical and cultural buildings and artifacts from this area's pioneer days.

Next, head back the way you came and head south toward Oconaluftee on New Found Gap Road. Enroute, stop at the Chimney Tops where there is a 3/4 mile, self-guided nature trail through a cove hardwood forest. You can stop at the Chimney Tops picnic area and have lunch.

After this, continue south on New Found Gap Road to Oconaluftee Visitor's Center. Shortly beyond the visitor's center is the Mountain Farm Museum, a collection of old farm buildings from around the smokies area. Re-enactments of pioneer farm life are performed here from spring until late fall.

Then head back north toward Gatlinburg, but take a quick stop at the Mingus Mill where daily

demonstrations are held.
